NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

At its 91st meeting on 21 December 1978, the General Assembly adopted resolution 33/182 A,* entitled "Situation in Namibia resulting from the illegal occupation of the Territory by South Africa". In paragraph 13 of that resolution, the General Assembly

"Recommends that, in the light of South Africa's failure to comply with the provisions of Security Council resolution 385 (1976) and subsequent resolutions, the Council should urgently convene to take effective measures, including sanctions provided for under Chapter VII of the Charter, particularly the imposition of comprehensive economic sanctions, including a trade embargo, an oil embargo and a complete arms embargo".
