Maintenance of international security

The General Assembly,

Noting that with the end of the era of the cold war and of bipolar confrontation the United Nations faces new tasks in the area of maintaining international peace and security, achieving social progress and better standards of life in larger freedom,

Aspiring to promote a greater convergence of views among Member States as to the priorities of the United Nations in shaping a more stable international order,

Noting with appreciation that the Secretary-General submitted ideas and proposals in his report entitled "An Agenda for Peace", in particular dealing with strengthening and enhancement of the effectiveness, within the framework and in accordance with the provisions of the Charter, of the United Nations potential in the area of preventive diplomacy, peacemaking, peace-keeping and post-conflict peace-building,

Noting also ideas and proposals of the Secretary-General contained in his report entitled "New Dimensions of Arms Regulation and Disarmament in the Post-Cold War Era",

1. Decides to continue consideration of the question of maintenance of international security taking into account new international realities and new tasks before the United Nations in the area of strengthening collective efforts to maintain international peace and security;

2. Invites all Member States to provide their views on further consideration of the question of maintenance of international security, taking into account, inter alia, appropriate provisions of the Secretary-General's reports "An Agenda for Peace" and "New Dimensions of Arms Regulation and Disarmament in the Post-Cold War Era", and requests the Secretary-General to submit a relevant report to the General Assembly at its forty-eighth session;

3. Decides to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-eighth session an item entitled "Maintenance of international security".
