LETTER DATED 6 NOVEMBER 1992 FROM THE PERMANENT
REPRESENTATIVE OF KUWAIT TO THE UNITED NATIONS
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

As you may recall, Kuwait has communicated to you as early as November 1990 (S/21961) the extent of the damage incurred in the Kuwaiti health service as a result of the inhuman practices of the Iraqi occupation forces. Furthermore, in one of the lists forwarded to you on 25 April 1991 Kuwait had indicated that a number of incubators have been seized by Iraqi authorities.

In this regard I should like to draw your attention to the attached document of items returned by the Iraqi regime on 26 August 1992 at Ar'ar, Saudi Arabia. The document lists two incubators (items 21 and 22) among the items handed over, under the supervision of the United Nations. In spite of allegations to the contrary, this list is a clear proof of the complicity of the Iraqi regime in destroying basic human services in Kuwait.

I should appreciate it if the letter and the enclosures be distributed as a document of the Security Council.

KUWAITI PROPERTY RETURNED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF IRAQ

Pursuant to paragraph 2(d) of Security Council resolution 686 (1991) which demands that Iraq "immediately begin to return all Kuwaiti property seized by Iraq, to be completed in the shortest possible period", and with reference to the letter dated 19 March 1991 from the President of the Security Council to the Secretary-General concerning the modalities for return of property from Iraq to Kuwait (S/22361) as well as to paragraph 15 of Security Council resolution 687 (1991) which requests the Secretary-General "to report to the Security Council on the steps taken to facilitate the return of all Kuwaiti property seized by Iraq, including a list of any property that Kuwait claims has not been returned or which has not been returned intact", it is hereby certified that on the date of 26 August 1992 at the location of Ar'Ar, Saudi Arabia, the Government of the State of Kuwait accepted delivery of the items of property returned by the Government of the Republic of Iraq that are listed in Annex A hereto. It is acknowledged that Annex A presents a breakdown of the following in respect of each property item: (a) item, (b) truck number, (c) starting box/lot number, (d) ending box/lot number, (e) whether or not the item has been inspected by the parties and (f) if the item was inspected, whether or not the Governments of the State of Kuwait and the Republic of Iraq recorded observations pertaining to alleged loss, damage or alteration in respect of the item.

I. The parties acknowledge that the returned property has been inspected and that:

~~(1) there has been no loss, damage or alteration in respect of the property items listed in Annex A, or~~

(2) the Government of the State of Kuwait has registered, in Annex B hereto, its observations pertaining to alleged loss, damage or alteration in respect of the property items listed in Annex A

- II. The parties acknowledge that inspection of the returned property was not feasible and that the Government of the State of Kuwait reserves the right to submit to the United Nations, within thirty (30) days of this hand-over date, any observations pertaining to alleged loss, damage or alteration in respect to the property items listed in Annex A accompanied by a copy of this document.
