LETTER DATED 9 NOVEMBER 1992 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF
BELGIUM TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE
SECURITY COUNCIL

My Government is extremely alarmed by the situation which now prevails in the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

As the Security Council, since the adoption of its resolution 713 (1991) and all its other subsequent resolutions, has undertaken to continue active consideration of this question, I have the honour to request, on behalf of my Government, that you convene an urgent meeting of the Council.

In my opinion, the Security Council's work would be usefully aided by the presence, under rule 39 of its rules of procedure, of the two co-chairmen of the International Conference on the former Yugoslavia, Mr. Vance and Mr. Owen, as well as that of Mr. Mazowiecki, the author of two reports on the situation of human rights in the territory of the former Yugoslavia, the first of which has already been distributed as an official document of the Security Council (S/24516 of 3 September 1992).

I should be grateful if you would have this letter circulated as a Security Council document.
