FINANCIAL FMERGENCY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Analysis of the financial situation of the United Mations

Report of the Secretary-General

- 1. At its thirty-fourth session the General Assembly, in its consideration of the item 'Financial emergency of the United Nations', had before it the report of the Secretary General (A/C.5/34/44 and Corr.1), providing an analysis of the financial situation of the United Nations, but decided to defer this item for consideration until its thirty-fifth session. In this regard the Secretary-Ceneral presents, herewith a current report which up-dates to 30 June 1980 the information contained in document A/C.5/34/44.
- 2. Annexes I through V of the present report provide detailed information regarding the extent, rate of increase and composition of the deficit of the Organization, as well as voluntary contributions received from Member States and other sources. They are entitled as follows:
 - Annex I. Comparative analysis of the short term deficit of the United Nations as at 30 June 1980 and 1979
 - Annex II. United Nations regular budget: estimated withholding by Member States from the regular budget of the United Nations
 - Annex III. Estimated withholding by certain Member States which they have stated to be for reasons of principle. United Nations Emergency Force (UNFF) and United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF) and United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL).
 - Annex IV. United Mations Special Account voluntary contributions as at 30 June 1980 and 1979
 - Annex V. United Nations General Fund. Working Capital Fund and special accounts: estimated statement of cash position for 1980.

- 3. With regard to annex I, it should be noted, as it has been in the past (documents A/AC.184/1, A/31/37, A/C.5/33/46 and A/C.5/34/44), that the "B" deficit is the "A" deficit plus the amount which some Member States feel is to be paid or credited from 'surplus accounts' to Member States that paid contributions to UNEF (1956) and the United Nations Operation in the Congo (ONUC). There have been estimated increases in the short-term "A" and "B" deficits since they were last reported to the Fifth Committee in the report of the Secretary-General on the financial situation of the United Nations contained in document A/C.5/34/44 dated 20 November 1979. For the calendar year 1980 (estimated at 30 June 1980), they rose 11.0 per cent and 10.0 per cent, respectively, or from \$188.4 million and \$205.1 million to \$209.2 million and \$225.7 million, representing an over-all increase of \$20.8 million in the "A" and \$20.6 million in the "B" deficits. On an individual account basis, the United Nations regular budget deficit rose \$3.9 million, that of UNEF/UNDOF \$4.1 million, that of UNIFIL \$15.3 million and that of UNEF (1956) \$1.7 million. However, these increases, totalling \$25 million, were reduced to the \$20.6 million net figure shown for the "B" deficit by an offset of interest earned during the period of \$4.3 million and a reduction in the ONUC deficit of \$0.1 million.
- 4. Annex II gives details by activity within the United Nations regular budget of the estimated withholdings of Member States. Annex III provides information by Member States for UNEF/UNDOF and UNIFIL withholdings.
- 5. Annex IV provides a comparative schedule as between 30 June 1980 and 30 June 1979 of voluntary contributions from Member States and other sources of income to the United Nations Special Account. Although there have been no new contributions by Member States, this schedule shows a net increase in the Special Account of \$4.3 million, representing interest earned.
- 6. Annex V is a cash-flow schedule for the year 1980. Through 31 August 1980 the figures provided are actual, but for the last four months of the year they are estimated. It is anticipated that there will be a deficit balance of \$6,700,000 in this account at year-end. In this connexion, it should be pointed out that variances in actual collections or expenditure, or both, from those assumed for the months of September to December 1980 could result in a significant difference in the balance anticipated at year-end.
