LETTER DATED 15 JANUARY 1993 FROM THE CHARGE D'AFFAIRES A.I.
OF THE PERMANENT MISSION OF KUWAIT TO THE UNITED NATIONS
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

On instructions from my Government, I should like to convey the following:

The continued presence of six Iraqi police posts in Kuwaiti territory is a serious violation of the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Kuwait, and constitutes a serious breach of Security Council resolutions, in particular resolutions 687, 689 and 773. The Security Council has insisted in its letter to the Secretary-General dated 8 January 1993 on their speedy removal, by 15 January 1993 at the latest. Today, 15 January, there is no indication that Iraq has removed these police posts. Kuwait strongly protests and condemns such continued presence.

Kuwait attaches great importance to action by the Security Council to bring about the removal of these posts. A decision by the Council on this issue should be effective in deterring Iraq from using any pretext to further violate the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Kuwait.

I should be grateful if you would have this letter circulated as a document of the Security Council.
