LETTER DATED 11 JANUARY 1993 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF IRAN TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

Upon instructions from my Government, I have the honour to bring to your attention the following instances of violations by Iraq of the terms of the cease-fire between the two countries.

- 1. On 5 July 1992, at 1710 hours, one Iraqi soldier was seen conducting observation at the geographical coordinates of 347-736 on the map of Nahr-Anbar and Ein-Khosh, south-west of border pillar 22/2.
- 2. On 6 July 1992, 31 Iraqi vehicles were seen trafficking at the geographical coordinates of 96-52 and 98-51 on the map of Marivan, in no man's land, north of border pillars 94/6 and 95.
- 3. On 7 July 1992, nine Iraqi vehicles were seen trafficking at the geographical coordinates of 98-51 and 96-52 on the map of Marivan in no man's land, north of border pillars 94/6 and 95.
- 4. On 8 July 1992, 30 Iraqi vehicles were seen trafficking at the geographical coordinates of 98-51 on the map of Marivan in no man's land, north of border pillar 95.
- 5. On 9 July 1992, one Iraqi patrol vehicle disembarked four soldiers at the geographical coordinates of 353-435 on the map of Kuh-tunnel, south of border pillar 25/11, and then moved towards the west.
- 6. On 11 July 1992, 27 Iraqi vehicles were observed trafficking at the geographical coordinates of 98-51 and 96-53 on the map of Marivan, north of border pillars 94/6 and 95.
- 7. On 11 July 1992, at 1150 hours, Iraqi forces deployed a Grinov machine-gun at the geographical coordinates of 64-27 on the map of Kani-sheikh in no man's land, south of border pillars 39/4 and 39/5.

- 8. On 11 July 1992, at 2030 hours, two Iraqi forces were seen surveying the area at the geographical coordinates of 58-38 on the map of Sumar in no man's land, south of border pillar 40/5.
- 9. On 12 July 1992, 15 fully-equipped Iraqi forces were seen conducting training at the geographical coordinates of 010-924 on the map of Meymeh River, south of border pillar 24/2.
- 10. On 12 July 1992, an Iraqi patrol vehicle entered the sentry post of Alshoeyb at the geographical coordinates of 703-205 on the map of Chazabeh in no man's land, north of border pillar 15 and south of border pillar 16. The vehicle returned after its passengers were briefed.
- 11. On 15 July 1992, at 0110 hours, four Iraqi vehicles, with their lights on, were seen moving southward from Al-tahrir sentry post at the geographical coordinates of 565-415 on the map of Hur-al-Hoveizeh in no man's land, north of border pillar 21/5.
- 12. On 15 July 1992, one Iraqi soldier fired bullets with a light weapon at the geographical coordinates of 28-78 on the map of Nahre-anbar, west of border pillar 22/29.
- 13. On 15 July 1992, 24 Iraqi vehicles were seen trafficking at the geographical coordinates of 98-51 and 96-53 on the map of Marivan in no man's land, north of border pillars 95 and 94/6.
- 14. On 16 July 1992, 21 Iraqi vehicles were seen trafficking at the geographical coordinates of 98-51 on the map of Marivan in no man's land, north of border pillar 95.
- 15. On 17 July 1992, 32 Iraqi vehicles were seen trafficking at the geographical coordinates of 98-51 and 96-53 on the map of Marivan in no man's land, near border pillars 95 and 94/6.
- 16. On 17 July 1992, at 1000 and 1920 hours, an Iraqi soldier was seen conducting observation at the geographical coordinates of 30-81 and 344-755 on the map of Nahre-Anbar and Ein-Khosh in no man's land, west of border pillars 22/30 and 22/23.
- 17. On 17 July 1992, at 1055-1200 hours, 20 Iraqi forces were observed installing barbed wires and planting mines at the geographical coordinates of 559-400 on the map of Sumar in no man's land, south-west of border pillars 41 and 42.
- 18. On 17 July 1992, at 1105 hours, 13 Iraqi forces were observed being replaced and transferred at the geographical coordinates of 59-33 and 58-31 on the map of Kani-Sheikh in no man's land, south and west of border pillars 40/1 and 39/7.

- 19. On 18 July 1992, 30 Iraqi vehicles were seen trafficking at the geographical coordinates of 96-53 and 98-51 on the map of Marivan in no man's land, around border pillars 94/6 and 95.
- 20. On 18 July 1992, at 0800-1200 hours, passengers of an Iraqi patrol vehicle were seen surveying at the geographical coordinates of 58-39 on the map of Sumar in no man's land, west of border pillar 40/5.
- 21. On 19 July 1992, 34 Iraqi vehicles were observed trafficking at the geographical coordinates of 98-51 and 96-53 on the map of Marivan in no man's land, around border pillars 95 and 94/6.
- 22. On 20 July 1992, at 0900 hours, seven Iraqi forces were observed constructing an observation post at the geographical coordinates of 581-385 on the map of Sumar in no man's land, south of border pillar 40/5.
- 23. On 20 July 1992, at 0915 hours, three passengers of an Iraqi patrol vehicle were observed surveying at the geographical coordinates of 703-219 on the map of Chazabeh in no man's land, south of border pillar 16.
- 24. On 20 July 1992, at 0950 hours, Iraqi forces were seen planting mines at the geographical coordinates of 535-448 on the map of Sumar in no man's land, north-west of border pillar 44/2.
- 25. On 20 July 1992, at 1100 hours, 10 Iraqi forces were seen constructing an observation post at the geographical coordinates of 576-391 on the map of Sumar in no man's land, around border pillar 40/5.
- 26. On 21 July 1992, 22 Iraqi civilian vehicles were observed trafficking at the geographical coordinates of 98-51 and 96-53 on the map of Marivan in no man's land, around border pillars 95 and 94/6.
- 27. On 21 July 1992, Iraqi forces stationed at the geographical coordinates of 645-276 on the map of Kani-Sheikh in no man's land, border pillar 39/4, fired Grinov shells into air.
- 28. On 22 July 1992, 30 Iraqi vehicles were observed trafficking at the geographical coordinates of 98-51 and 96-53 on the map of Marivan in no man's land, around border pillars 95 and 94/6.
