Letter dated 25 November 1992 from the Permanent Representative  
of Bosnia and Herzegovina to the United Nations addressed to  
the Secretary-General

Pursuant to my letter of 24 November 1992 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/24855), I wish to provide the following additional information that raises the same concerns and reiterates my call for urgent response from the Security Council.

Today, we have received reports, also widely reported in televised media, that another convoy headed for Srebrenica has been halted by Serbian and Montenegrin troops.

I must emphasize the significance of the latest developments with respect to the mandate of the United Nations Protection Force (UNPROFOR) in Security Council resolution 770 (1992), given the obstruction of desperately needed humanitarian deliveries in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

It is therefore with great urgency that I request, once again, that you take action pursuant to resolution 770 (1992), as outlined in my earlier letter, with special consideration to immediate commencement of "air-drops" of food.

May I ask for your kind assistance in circulating this letter as a document of the General Assembly, under agenda item 143, and of the Security Council.
