LETTER DATED 29 JANUARY 1993 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to refer to Security Council resolution 797 (1992) of 16 December 1992 by which the Council decided to establish a United Nations Operation in Mozambique (ONUMOZ), and to my letter to you dated 11 January 1993 (S/25121) concerning the composition of the military component of ONUMOZ.

Having completed additional consultations, I propose that the military elements of ONUMOZ be also composed of contingents from the following States, all of which have expressed their readiness in principle to make the necessary personnel available: Botswana, Canada, Guinea-Bissau, Hungary, India, Spain and Zambia.

I am awaiting replies from certain other States which have been informally approached and will revert to the Security Council when I have an indication of whether they are also ready in principle to contribute military personnel to this mission.

I should be grateful if you would bring these matters to the attention of the members of the Security Council.
