LETTER DATED 28 AUGUST 1980 FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON THE SITUATION WITH REGARD TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECLARATION ON THE GRANTING OF INDEPENDENCE TO COLONIAL COUNTRIES AND PEOPLES ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to transmit herewith for the attention of the Security Council the text of a consensus concerning the question of Namibia (A/AC.109/632) 1/, adopted by the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, at its 1181st meeting, on 21 August 1980.

Paragraph 12 of the consensus reads as follows:

"(12) Given South Africa's increasing resort to force in order to perpetuate its illegal domination of the Territory, its flagrant refusal to comply with the terms of Security Council resolution 385 (1976) and its repeated acts of aggression against neighbouring African States, the Special Committee recommends that the Security Council urgently convene to consider imposing comprehensive and mandatory sanctions on South Africa under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, with a view to securing the speedy compliance of the South African régime with the decisions of the Security Council."
