The Commission on Human Rights,

Recalling General Assembly resolution 45/98 of 14 December 1990,

Recalling also its resolutions 1991/19 of 1 March 1991 and 1992/21 of
28 February 1992 and Economic and Social Council decision 1991/236 of
31 May 1991, which established the mandate of an independent expert on the
right to own property alone as well as in association with others,

Taking note of the final report of the Independent Expert
(E/CN.4/1993/15),
