LETTER DATED 19 SEPTEMBER 1980 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF LEBANON TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF
THE SECURITY COUNCIL

On instructions from my Government and pursuant to my letters of 19 August 1980 (S/14114), and 22 August 1980 (S/14120), I have the honour to draw your attention to the following acts of aggression committed by Israel against my country, Lebanon, on 17/18 September 1980:

(a) At 1340 hours, the towns of Nabatiyeh and Chateau Beaufort were continuously shelled until 2000 hours, with property damaged.

(b) At 1350 hours, five artillery shells fell near the village of Ain ed-Dilb, within the province of Sidon.

(c) At 1400 hours the city of Tyre was shelled for 50 minutes. This resulted in one person killed and three wounded. There was extensive damage to property, and the power and telephone lines were cut.

(d) At 1620 hours, Tyre, el-Bass and Bourj esh-Shamali were shelled again. As a result, one child was killed and three persons were wounded.

(e) At 1745 hours, three shells fell in the suburbs of Sidon, and another shell fell near Mar Elias.

(f) At 2400 hours, Israeli aircraft and naval vessels bombarded the Tyre area, concentrating on the southern city coastline, and flares were dropped over the area. Shelling ceased at 0400 hours on 18 September 1980.

This operation caused extensive property damage. It also caused panic among the inhabitants, a large portion of whom fled to other parts of the country.

I would be grateful Mr. President, if you could have this letter circulated as a document of the Security Council under the item "The situation in the Middle East".
