The Commission on Human Rights,

 $\underline{\text{Guided}}$  by the principles embodied in the Charter of the United Nations, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the International Covenants on Human Rights,

Reaffirming that all Member States have an obligation to promote and protect human rights and fundamental freedoms and to fulfil the obligations they have undertaken under the various international instruments in this field,

 $\underline{\text{Taking note}}$  of recent developments in the situation of human rights in China,

<u>Concerned</u> at the continuing reports of violations of human rights and fundamental freedoms in China, as well as measures which threaten the distinct cultural, religious and ethnic identity of persons belonging to minorities,

Taking note of the reports of the Special Rapporteurs on the question of torture (E/CN.4/1993/26), on extrajudicial, summary or arbitrary executions (E/CN.4/1993/46), on the question of religious intolerance (E/CN.4/1993/62), as well as the report of the Working Group on Enforced or Involuntary Disappearances (E/CN.4/1993/25),

- 1. <u>Expresses concern</u> over the continuing reports of violations of human rights and fundamental freedoms in China, including severe restrictions on the rights of freedom of expression, religion, assembly, association and fair trial;
- 2. <u>Calls upon</u> the Government of the People's Republic of China to take measures to ensure the observance of human rights and to improve the administration of justice in China;
- 3. <u>Invites</u> the Government of the People's Republic of China to continue to cooperate with the Special Rapporteurs and Working Groups;
- 4. Requests the Secretary-General to bring the present resolution to the attention of the Government of the People's Republic of China and to prepare a report for the Commission on Human Rights at its fiftieth session on the situation of human rights in China on the basis of available information, including the reports of the Special Rapporteurs, Working Groups and treaty bodies as well as any other relevant information.
