I. ORGANIZATIONAL MATTERS

A. Opening and duration of the session

1. The Preparatory Committee held its second session at United Nations Headquarters from 22 August to 2 September 1994. The Preparatory Committee held _____ plenary meetings (1st to _____) and a number of informal meetings, as well as _____ meetings of the Working Group on agenda items 3 and 5.
2. The session was opened by the Chairman of the Preparatory Committee.
3. At the 1st meeting, on 22 August, the Secretary-General addressed the Preparatory Committee.
4. At the same meeting, the Chairman of the Preparatory Committee made an introductory statement.

B. Attendance

5.
