# Administrative and financial implications of draft resolution A/35/L.2/Rev.1

## Report of the Fifth Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Carl C. PEDERSEN (Canada)

1. At its 20th meeting, on 20 October 1980, the Fifth Committee considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/27 and Corr.1) on the administrative and financial implications of draft resolution A/35/L.2/Rev.1, as well as the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/35/7/Add.4).

2. The statements and observations made during the Committee's consideration of this question are reflected in the summary record for the meeting (A/C.5/35/SR.20).

### DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, by a recorded vote of 77 to 17, with 12 abstentions, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/35/L.2/Rev.1, an additional appropriation of \$319,800 would be required under section 1 of the programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981. Furthermore, an additional appropriation of \$79,600 would be required under section 31 (Staff assessment), which would be offset by an increase of the same amount under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment). These appropriations would arise in the light of the interpretation given by the Secretary-General in paragraph 11 of document A/C.5/35/27 and Corr.1 to the request addressed to him in operative paragraph 8 of the draft resolution. If operative paragraphs 2, 4 and 5 of the draft resolution were to be implemented, the provisions of General Assembly resolution 34/231 on unforeseen and extraordinary expenses would have to A/35/551 English Page 2

be invoked, unless further appropriation action is taken by the Assembly at its thirty-fifth session.

- 4. The result of the voting was as follows: 1/

  - <u>Against</u>: Afghanistan, Bulgaria, Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Congo, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Ethiopia, German Democratic Republic, Hungary, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Madagascar, Mongolia, Mozambique, Poland, Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Viet Nam.
  - <u>Abstaining</u>: Algeria, Benin, Central African Republic, Chad, Guinea, India, Ivory Coast, Mexico, Uganda, United Republic of Tanzania, Zambia, Zimbabwe.
