Subject: ESTABLISHIEM OF TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE ADMINISTRATION

. Authority

There is hereby established in the United Nations Secretariat a Technical issistance Administration, responsible for the operation and administration of the programmes authorized by General Assembly resolution 58 (I), advisory social relfare functions; General Assembly resolution 200 (III), economic development in under-developed countries; General Assembly resolution 246 (III), training in public administration; Economic and Social Council resolution 222 A (IX), expanded programme of technical assistance for economic development of under-eveloped countries; and General Assembly resolution 305 (IV), technical assistance or economic development.

To this end, staff of the Departments of Economic and Social Affairs concerned ith the operation of these programmes are transferred to the Technical Assistance dministration as of 1 August 1950. In addition, all funds under sections 25, 15a and 25b of the 1950 budget appropriations are to be administered by the lechnical Assistance Administration, also as of 1 August 1950.

2. Organization

The Technical Assistance Administration will be administered by a Directorioneral, assisted by a Deputy Director-Ceneral, under the rules and regulations joverning personnel and financial administration of the Secretariat. Details of the organization of the Administration by division and section, together with a delineation of their respective functions will be established by Administrative instruction at a later date.

. Responsibility of Technical Assistance Administration

The Technical Assistance Administration will be responsible for the operation of the various programmes specified in section 1 above, such as organization of

/composite ST/AFS/SGB/32/Rev.7 composite missions to countries as approved and in accordance with policies established by the appropriate organs of the United Nations, furnishing individua advisers to Governments; fellowships and scholarship programmes; seminars and training institutes, and demonstration centres.

The Director-General will report directly to the Secretary-General.

4. Responsibility of Departments

The Departments of Economic and Social Affairs will continue to be responsible for conducting research projects and preparing studies required by the technical assistance programme, and should be consulted on all questions of policing relating to economic development and social welfare.

The Department of Administrative and Financial Services will be responsible for financial administration of the Special Account; for budgetary and financial control of funds authorized by the General Assembly or allocated from the Special Account to the United Nations; and for personnel administration in accordance with the Staff Rules of the United Nations.
