NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

New York, 1952

To the Royal Board of Public Health.

In connection with representations made by the Royal Board of Public Health in a letter of 5 September 1951, His Majesty, having this day issued a Decree* amending the text of section 1 of the Decree of 16 September 1933 (No.559) with certain provisions concerning narcotic substances and preparations, has seen fit to withdraw* as from 1 January 1952 the regulations issued by His Majesty on 7 October 1949 regarding the trade in d, 1-4, 4-diphenyl-6-demethylamino-3-heptanone and salts thereof.
