LAWS AND REGULATIONS

PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION OF 13 JULY 1931 FOR LIMITING THE MANUFACTURE AND REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS, AS AMENDED BY THE PROTOCOL OF 11 DECEMBER 1946

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

"Unauthorized production, manufacture and sale of narcotic drugs and poisons

Article 208*

- (1) Any person who, without authorization, engages in the production, manufacture or sale, or in any other way traffics in, or purchases or transmits, for the purpose of sale, opium, cocaine, morphine or other narcotic or poisonous drugs, shall be punished by imprisonment for a period of not less than three months and not more than three years.
- (2) Persons who engage in the activities mentioned in paragraph 1 above as a normal occupation or who band themselves together for the purpose of engaging in such activities, shall be punished by imprisonment for a period of not less than six months or by rigorous imprisonment for a period of not more than five years.
- (3) The narcotic drugs, or poisons, as well as the means for their preparation, shall be confiscated.
