In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE RIGHT HONOURABLE ERNEST FREDERICK WATERMEYER, A MEMBER OF HIS MAJESTY'S MOST HONOURABLE PRIVY COUNCIL, OFFICER ADMINISTERING THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA.

ADDITION TO THE FIFTH SCHEDULE OF THE MEDICAL, DENTAL AND PHARMACY ACT 1928 (ACT No. 13 OF 1928)

Under the powers vested in me by section sixty-seven of the Medical, Dental and Pharmacy Act, 1928 (Act No. 13 of 1928), on the recommendation of the South-African Medical and Dental Council and the South-African Pharmacy Board, and on the authority of a resolution of both Houses of Parliament as required by the said section. I hereby declare the following substances to be habit-forming drugs added to the Fifth Schedule of the said Act, with effect from the date hereof:

"Phenadoxone (6-morpholino-4:4-diphenylheptan-3-one hydrochloride) under whatever name it may be described or sold.

Amidone (d1-2-dimethylamino-4:4-diphenylheptan-5-one), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of amidone."
