II. ANNOTATIONS TO THE PROVISIONAL AGENDA

Item 1: Election of officers

In accordance with past practice in UNCTAD, it is proposed that the $\ensuremath{\mathtt{Bureau}}$ of the

Ad Hoc Working Group consist of 7 members (a Chairman, 5 Vice-Chairmen and a Rapporteur), to be elected in accordance with the following geographical distribution: 4 from lists A and C combined, 2 from list B and 1 from list D.

Item 2: Adoption of the agenda and organization of work

The Working Group will have available five working days from 28 November to 2 December 1994. Throughout the session, interpretation facilities will be available. At the first meeting, on 28 November 1994, an opening statement will be made by the Officer-in-Charge of UNCTAD or his representative. The rest of the session will be primarily devoted to items 3 and 4 of the agenda.

The secretariat's report (TD/B/WG.6/2), which covers both items 3 and 4 of the agenda, serves as a background for the deliberations. The report contains (i) a comparative analysis of current and planned schemes, with a view to discussing concepts such as mutual recognition and equivalencies; and (ii) an examination of the possibilities for taking into account the interests of developing countries in the elaboration of eco-labelling criteria. At the opening of the session, supplementary documentation will be made available as miscellaneous reports. Representatives of some international organizations including UNEP, GATT and ISO will make presentations. Members of the Group are encouraged to report on national experiences, taking into account the analysis and recommendations contained in the secretariat's report.

Item 4: Market opportunities for "environmentally friendly" products

This agenda item is intended as a follow up to the discussions under item 3. The secretariat's report (TD/B/WG.6/2) investigates ways and means for identifying and certifying environmentally friendly products. In addition, report TD/B/CN.1/25 on "Identification of means by which the competitiveness of natural products with environmental advantages could be improved - reducing the environmental stress of consumption without affecting consumer satisfaction", prepared for the third session of the Standing Committee on Commodities, will be made available as additional background documentation. National experiences of when it has been particularly difficult or easy to market environmentally friendly products will throw new light on this issue. It is thus recommended that national presentations provide examples in order to be able to arrive at suggestions for marketing "environmentally friendly" products.

Group members are requested to hand in national presentations they have brought with them at the latest by $5.00~\rm p.m.$ on $28~\rm November$ so that they can be included in the informal documents which will be issued by the secretariat on the following day.

A draft provisional agenda for the second session of the Working Group will be submitted in the light of the discussions at this session.
