

LETTER FROM THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE
GOVERNMENT OF BULGARIA TO THE PRESIDENT
OF THE COMMISSION OF INVESTIGATION OF
THE SECURITY COUNCIL

To the Chairman of the Commission
of Investigation of the Security Council

In confirming the statements I made yesterday to the Investigation Commission I have the honour to present herewith the following opinions and suggestions of the Bulgarian delegation concerning the questions raised in the same meeting by you.

1. The Bulgarian delegation is prepared to present without delay its point of view on the problems to be settled by the Investigation Commission, in accordance with the decision of the Security Council of December 19, 1946. The delegation has been entrusted with full authority by the Government of the Peoples Republic of Bulgaria and can present to the Commission all materials, which might be of interest.

2. The Bulgarian delegation believes that the Commission should begin immediately the hearing of the statements of the delegations concerned as well as all circles and persons in Greece who could supply the Commission with materials and information of a nature to facilitate its task, also to visit as it deems fit other places in Greece, which might help to ascertain the truth as to the character and nature of events in this country, which are the source of the present international difficulties and which brought about the investigation. Thus completing the first and main stage of its work, the Commission will set its further course: which other places in Greece and the remaining three Balkan countries should be visited, when and whether the capitals of the countries concerned should be visited, etc.

The Bulgarian Government is prepared to give its full cooperation

to the Investigation Commission to visit eventually Sofia and those places in Bulgaria which it might deem necessary to visit within the scope of its task, as set by the resolution of the Security Council of December 19, 1946.

3. The Bulgarian delegation considers it desirable, even necessary that the delegates of the four countries concerned should participate in all meetings of the Investigation Commission, so as to speed up and facilitate its task.

4. The Bulgarian delegation further believes that the inquiry should be conducted generally in the presence of press representatives, before the world public opinion.
