We have the honour to inform that the Governments of the Republic of Cuba and the Republic of Latvia, in order to ensure greater development of friendly relations between them, to promote cooperation in areas of common interest for the benefit of the two countries, to act jointly in support of peace in the international community in accordance with the purposes and principles established in the United Nations Charter and with reference to the relevant provisions of the Vienna Convention that regulate diplomatic relations between States, have decided to establish, as from 20th December 1991, diplomatic relations between them at Ambassadorial level.

We have the honour, further, to request that this information be transmitted to the Permanent Missions of Member States of the United Nations.
