(44) Forty-four pieces wrapped in thin white paper and found concealed in between the tyres and tubes of both the wheels of the cycle, which the accused rode.

5 lbs. 6 9/32 ozs. (2 kg. 446 grs.) Opium at Rs.2/-per tola. (U.S.\$0.60) (11.66 grs.)

The accused stated that a Cantonese Mang Wah had given the cycle with the drug to him.

(i) Statement: The accused stated that a Centonese Mang Wah gave him the cycle somewhere in Sukhalaji Street and told him to carry it and hand it over to a Chinaman on the S.S. Ting Sang.

In the investigation that followed this seizure Rao Sahib Goes, officer i/c of the Special Investigation Opium Branch accompanied by two of > his men Preventive Officers Messrs. Desai and Vincent, assisted Inspector Mr. Bashruddin of the Prohibition Central Intelligence Section, in trying to locate the notorious Mang Wah, who seems to be lying low and could not be traced.

The accused was sentenced to three months rigourous imprisonment and to pay a fine of Rs.500/- (U.S.\$150.80), or in default three months further rigourous imprisonment.
