Note by the Secretary-General

In accordance with article 23 of the Convention for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs of 13 July 1931, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following report on the above-mentioned seizures to the Members of the United Nations and to the other parties to the Convention.

NARCOTIC SEIZURE REPORT - U.S. Occupied Korea No. 2

1. Date of seizure - September 1945 to May 1946
2. Place of seizure, and kind and quantity of drugs seized.

3. Possession, use, sale, etc., of heroin is now prohibited in Korea since it is considered unnecessary for medical treatment. To eliminate the possibility of heroin in Korea reaching illicit markets, the above-listed heroin was destroyed 22 May 1946, and any further seizures of heroin will be destroyed.
