SEIZURE OF 906 GRAMMES OF POPTY HEADS AT WINNIPEG, MANITOBA ON JUNE 8, 1946

## Note by the Secretary-General

## 7. Remarks:

Subject, a prostitute, was arrested at 11.30 p.m. on the 8th of June, 1946, and was found to be in possession of a paper bag which contained one bound (453 grammes) of Poppy Heads which, she stated, had been given to her; and she was then on her way home to cook them. On being questioned she said there was another small quantity in her room. A search revealed a paper bag which also contained

one pound (453 grammes) of Poppy Heads. On the 11th June, 1946, Bell pleaded Guilty to the charge and was sentenced as shown.

An Appeal by subject's lawyer based oursly on law was struck off the list of proceedings.

An attempt to ascertain the source from which she obtained the Poppy Heads has so far been unsuccessful.
