SEIZURE OF 4 KG. 925 GR. OF HASHISH MADE AT KANTARA, 6 JULY 1947

Report Communicated by the Government of Egypt on 20 October 1947

Note by the Secretary-General

In accordance with Article 23 of the Convention for limiting the
Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs of
13 July 1931, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the
Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following report on the
above-mentioned seizure to the Members of the United Nations and to the
other parties to the Convention.

SEIZURE OF 4 KG. 925 GR. OF HASHISH AT KANTARA ON JULY 6th, 1947

(Case of AUDA MESSALLEM SOLIMAN)

On July 6th, 1947 when a patrol of the Camel Section of the Royal Frontiers Corps was following footprints of some smugglers, the force found AUDA MESSALLEM SOLIMAN in the vicinity of Abu Orouk.

On searching his cloak, 4 kg. 925 gr. of hashish were found hidden in it.

The accused admitted that he had bought the seized drug from Khan Younes at a price of L.E.13 (U.S.A. \$53.69), per kilogramme to sell in Egypt.

He was tried on 9.10.1947 by the Summary Native Court, Kantara, and sentenced to two years imprisonment and a fine of L.E. 400. (U.S.A. \$1652).

The source of origin of the seized drug is unknown.
