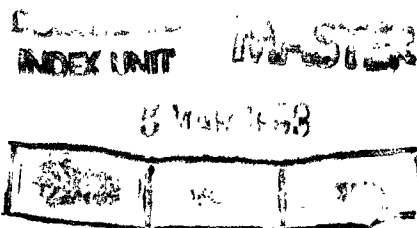

CO-ORDINATION OF INLAND TRANSPORT

Supplementary Note by the Secretary-General

Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East

In document E/CN.2/122 it was reported that the question of co-ordination of inland transport would be considered by the Inland Transport Committee of the Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East during its second session.

The Committee, meeting from 19 to 21 January 1953 at Bandung, Indonesia, reviewed this question and requested the Executive Secretary to continue studies in this field in conjunction with ICAO and the Economic Commission for Europe, with a view to ascertaining (1) the latest position in regard to the development of various modes of transport, (2) steps taken towards co-ordination and their effect, and (3) further steps contemplated, in order to suggest to governments how they could utilize this knowledge to their best advantage. The Committee recommended that in making these studies, due attention should be paid to the development of civil air transport and its harmonious blending into the existing systems.^{1/}
