We have the honour to inform you that, on
26 September, 1985, the Governments of Brazil and Botswana
simultaneously published, in Brasilia and Gaborone, a
joint communique regarding the establishment of diplomatic
relations. The text reads as follows:

"The Government of the Republic of Botswana and the Government of the Federative Republic of Brazil have today, 26 September, 1985, established diplomatic relations at Ambassadorial level. A joint statement made by the two Governments and signed by their representatives in London reads as follows:

"The Republic of Botswana and the Federative Republic of Brazil being desirous to promote and consolidate the ties of friendship between the people of Botswana and the people of Brazil on the basis of equality, mutual respect and non-interference in each others' internal affairs, have agreed to establish diplomatic relations at Ambassadorial level as from 26 September, 1985."
