Note Prepared by the Secretariat for the Convenience and Information of the Commission in Connection with Items 3 and 4 of the Agenda of the Second Session (Document E/CN.1/32/Rev.2)

- 1. At its Third Session the Economic and Social Council directed the Commission to establish a Sub-Commission on Employment and Economic Stability and a Sub-Commission on Economic Development. The Terms of Reference of the Sub-Commissions included under "Composition" the following:
 - "(i) The Sub-Commission shall be composed of seven persons selected by the Commission in consultation with the Secretary-General and subject to the consent of the governments of the countries of which the persons are nationals. Not more than one person shall be selected from any single country.
 - "(ii) The terms of office of the members shall be three years.

 Members shall be eligible for re-election. In the event that a member is unstill to serve for the full three-year term, a person selected by the Commission subject to the foregoing provisions should serve in his place for the remainder of the term."
- 2. In accordance with this directive from the Economic and Social Council, the Commission at its last Session agreed that the members of the Sub-Commissions should be elected at this, the second, Session of the Commission. It was also agreed that each Member of this Commission should submit to the Secretariat a list of names of those people who, in their judgment, have the qualifications necessary for carrying out the work of the Sub-Commissions.
- 3. The Secretariat prepared tables annexed to this document, including all

Dr. lange is recognized as one of the most outstanding theoretical economists in the United States. He has made original contributions in central fields of economic theory. He has an exceptionally keen theoretical mind with a particular ability to use his theoretical knowledges to bring out essential points in discussions on current topics of economic policy.

Among his students at Chicago he gained unanimous recognition as a most excellent teacher, and was understood even though his courses dealt with some of the most difficult parts of economic theory. In the discussion that followed the publication of Keynes' book on the "General Theory", lange made a real contribution to clarifying the ideas involved. (see e.g. his article on "The rate of interest and the Optimum Propensity to Consumer" (econometrica 1938).) In his recent book on "Price Flexibility and Employment" (Cowles Commission Monograph No. 8, Bloomington, Indiana, 1944) he has dealt with some of the most central problems in the Keynsian system, namely the problems of price rigidity as a possible cause of defective demand and unemployment.

His theoretical background and his practical experience, both as an ambassador and as an active participant in the work of the United Nations qualifies him in an exceptional degree as a member of the Sub-Commission.

TINDAHL OLEM

Dr. Lindahl is one of Sweden's leading economists and is internationally recognized as an authority on fiscal and monetary theories in their relation to employment and income. As professor in Uppsala he occupies the chair of the famous Knut Wicksell.

Professor Lindahl has been a trail blazer in his special field. He was one of the first, if not the first to bring out the view that the essence of the problems of public finance resides in the relations that link public finance to monetary policy, and to emphasize the role of the combined monetary and fiscal policy as tools of promoting full employment on a high level of real income and economic welfare. He took definite exception to the previously prevailing views that fiscal policy in order to be "sound" must not be contaminated by any connection with monetary policy. His ideas on these problems were laid down in two monographs in Swedish "Penningpolitikens Mal" ("The Objectives of Monetary Policy" Lund 1928, and "Penningpolitikens Medel") ("Measures of Monetary Policy") Lund 1930.

He is also the author of numerous articles and books on these and related subjects. Amongst his important contributions, available in English, one may mention his "Studies in the Theory of Money and Capital", London 1939. He also is one of the co-authors of "National Income of Sweden 1861-1930", London 1937, a monumental work in two large volumes.

Professor Lindahl has been extensively called upon by his government to serve as an economic advisor, particularly on problems of taxation and other problems of fiscal policy.

He thus combines thorough theoretical training and power of thought with practical knowledge and experience of economic policy and administration. This, in my opinion, makes him excellently qualified for membership in the Sub-Commission.

Dr. Maiwald was born on October 3rd 1902 in Oslavany. He took his degree at the Faculty of Law of the Masaryk University in Erno in 1925. and went to study economics in the United States, Great Britain, Switzerland and Germany as a fellow of the Laura Spelman Rockefeller Memorial. Back in his country, he became assistant of the Faculty of Taw in Brno. In 1931 he started working in the State Statistical Office in Prague where he joined the scientific department. During his activities there he compiled the index of industrial production and worked out the basis for industrial statistics in Czechoslovakia; later on he was entrusted with organizing the statistical service for home-trade and was in charge of the statistics of banking. After the war the Czechoslovak Government entrusted Dr. Maiwald with preparing the organization of a Gzechoslovak planning service, and after the National Planning Office had been established, he was appointed to the function of its President. He was member of the Provisional National Assembly for the Social Democratic Party, participating mainly in the activities of the Budget Committee in the capacity of its Deputy-Chairman.

His publications include, inter alia, the following: Economic Life and Credit, Praha 1937, Home Trade during the Last Economics, Vol I Praha 1946, Vol II, Praha 1947. Besides these he published a series of articles in economic periodicals and in the daily press, dealing with topical problems of economic policy. In the years of gravest economic depression, he intervened journalistically to bring about a change of the currency and credit policy of that time, advocating effective measures for combating the depression.

(Submitted by Prof. Frisch) - The name of Dr. Tinbergen is so well known that comments upon his qualifications for the proposed sub-committee would seem almost superfluous.

In Holland he occupies the position as the Leading economist and as principal economic advisor to the Dutch government. He is a statistician as well as an economist and is also a mathematician. His exceptional ability to combine these three disciplines has made him one of the world's leading econometricians.

Internationally he is probably best known through his work as a research director of the Economic Intelligence Section of the League of Nations in Geneva. His two publications resulting from this work ("Statistical Testing of Business Cycle Theories" I and II, Geneva 1938) are important developments in the quantative research in economics.

In his long list of publications one may also mention his recent book on "Theory of International Trade".

He has been active in the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations, indirectly as an expert adviser to the Netherlands Delegation. I strongly recommend his election as a member of the Sub-Commission.

42 years old, is a former student of the Ecole Polytechnique and the Ecole Nationale Superieure des Mines.

He has been Mining Engineer for five years and an official of the railroads for twelve years.

He is at present Associate Director General of the Societa Nationale des Chemins de fer francais (French National Railroads) with 40,000 kilometers of lines and 500,000 agents, where he concerns himself particularly with technical questions and relations with industry.

Mr. Armand'is at the same time technician and administrator. In the course of his career he has been in contact with a wide variety of industries, collieries, metallic mines, chemical industry, engineering and electrical industries particularly.

This combination of knowledge has enabled M. Armand to study especially the relationships of technical equipment with the general economy of a country and that is what earned him the nomination of Inspector General of the Ministry of National Economy, and to participate in the Monnet Plan; he has been designated to conduct at the Ecole Nationale d'Administration the course dedicated to "Technology in the Economy".
