COMPILATION OF COMMENTS AND SUGGESTIONS OF GOVERNMENTS
IN REGARD TO CONFLICTS OF LAWS IN THE FIELD OF
NATIONALITY OF MARRIED WOMEN

Subsequent to the issuance of document E/CN.6/142, the Secretary-General has received the reply of the Government of Netherlands to the "Analysis of Conflicts of Laws in the Field of Nationality of Married Women" (document E/CN.6/126), which is being reproduced hereinbelow.

NETHERLANDS

With reference to your letter of 27 January, 1950, SOA 149/6/02(1)JPH, concerning the "Analysis of Conflicts of Laws in the Field of Nationality of Married Women" (document E/CN.6/126), prepared by you pursuant to resolution 242(IX) (C) of the Economic and Social Council of 1 August 1949, I have the honour to inform you that my Government has found in it no reason for comments or suggestions.

As to their legal system in this respect the Netherlands belong to the group of countries, mentioned in Section III sub C of the report. This system has, so far, not led to difficulties of any importance with other states.
