SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/1994/20 of 20 January 1994, S/1994/20/Add.3 of 3 February 1994, S/1994/20/Add.12 of 8 April 1994, S/1994/20/Add.14 of 21 April 1994, S/1994/20/Add.21 of 10 June 1994 and S/1994/20/Add.33 of 31 August 1994.

During the week ending 5 November 1994, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The situation in Somalia (see S/23370/Add.11, S/23370/Add.16, S/23370/Add.30, S/23370/Add.34, S/23370/Add.48, S/25070/Add.12, S/25070/Add.23, S/25070/Add.38, S/25070/Add.43, S/25070/Add.46, S/1994/20/Add.4, S/1994/20/Add.21, S/1994/20/Add.33 and S/1994/20/Add.38; see also S/23370/Add.3)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3446th meeting, held on 31 October 1994 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General concerning the situation in Somalia (S/1994/1166).

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1994/1222) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1994/1222 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 953 (1994) (for the full text, see S/RES/953 (1994); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Forty-ninth Year, Resolutions and decisions of the Security Council, 1994).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3447th meeting, held on 4 November 1994 in accordance with the understanding reached in

its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General concerning the situation in Somalia, parts I and II (S/1994/1068) and S/1994/1166.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Kenya and Somalia, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1994/1242) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1994/1242 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 954 (1994) (for the full text, see S/RES/954 (1994); to be issued in <u>Official Records of the Security Council</u>, Forty-ninth Year, Resolutions and decisions of the Security Council, 1994).

The Security Council dealt with the item at its 3448th and 3449th meetings, held on 4 November 1994 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the letter dated 15 September 1994 from the Permanent Representatives of Argentina and New Zealand to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/1994/1063).

At the 3448th meeting, the President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the full text, see S/PRST/1994/62; to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fortyninth Year, Resolutions and decisions of the Security Council, 1994).

At the 3449th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Egypt, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Malaysia, the Netherlands, Sweden, Turkey and Ukraine, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.
