XIII. MEASURES TO IMPROVE THE SITUATION AND ENSURE THE HUMAN RIGHTS AND DIGNITY OF ALL MIGRANT WORKERS

1. The Commission considered agenda item 13 at its 64th meeting, on 9 March 1993, and at its 67th meeting, on 10 March 1993. 2/
2. In connection with item 13, the Commission had before it the Report of the Secretary-General on the Status of the International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families (E/CN.4/1993/51).
3. At the 64th meeting, in the general debate on item 13, a statement was made by the representative of Pakistan.
4. At the same meeting, the Commission also heard statements by the following non-governmental organizations: Centre Europe-Tiers Monde, Commission of the Churches on International Affairs of the World Council of Churches, International Indian Treaty Council, Sierra Club Legal Defense Fund, Inc., Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, World Federation of Democratic Youth.
5. At the 67th meeting, the representative of Mexico introduced draft resolution E/CN.4/1993/L.100, sponsored by Algeria*, Argentina, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, the Czech Republic, Ecuador*, France, Greece*, Mauritania, Mexico, Morocco*, Peru, Portugal, Romania, Rwanda*, Senegal* and Venezuela. Tunisia subsequently joined the sponsors.
6. The draft resolution was adopted without a vote.
7. A statement in explanation of his delegation's position was made by the representative of Japan.
