XVIII. EFFECTIVE FUNCTIONING OF BODIES ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO UNITED NATIONS HUMAN RIGHTS INSTRUMENTS

- 1. The Commission considered agenda item 18 concurrently with items 7, 8 and 17 (see chaps. VII, VIII and XVII) at its 17th to 21st meetings, on 11, 12 and 15 February, and at its 42nd meeting, on 26 February 1993. 2/
- 2. The Commission had before it the note by the Secretary-General on the effective implementation of international instruments on human rights, including reporting obligations under international instruments on human rights (A/47/628).
- 3. In the general debate on item 18, statements $\underline{3}/$ were made by the following members of the Commission: Australia (17th), Bulgaria (21st), Canada (21st), Finland (19th), Poland (21st), Romania (21st), United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (21st).
- 4. The Commission heard a statement by the observer for Hungary (18th).
- 5. The Commission also heard a statement by the non-governmental organization International Association of Jurists (18th).
- 6. At the 42nd meeting, on 26 February 1993, the representative of Canada introduced draft resolution E/CN.4/1993/L.34, sponsored by Argentina, Australia, Austria, Canada, Chile, Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Denmark*, Finland, France, the Netherlands, New Zealand*, Norway*, Poland, Portugal and Sweden*. Cameroon*, Cyprus, Germany, Italy* and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland subsequently joined the sponsors.
- 7. The draft resolution was adopted without a vote.
- 8. A statement in explanation of vote after the vote was made by the representative of Japan.
