## PATTERN OF CONFERENCES

Points for consideration by Sub-Committee 9 (Note by the Secretary of the Sub-Committee)

At the first meeting of Sub-Committee 9 of the Fifth Committee, on 4 November 1957, the Chairman proposed the following as the principal points for consideration:

- (1) Whether to adhere to the present classification of "Headquarters-based" and "Geneva-based" bodies, and, if so, whether to adopt the definition offered in paragraph 16 of the Secretary-General's report (A/C.5/722);
- (2) Whether to admit exceptions to the pattern, and, if so, how to achieve the proper balance in the conference workload between Headquarters and Geneva. /Testimony would be required in particular on the two points made in A/C.5/722, paragraph 13, viz:
  - (a) That the present number of meetings at Headquarters and Geneva exceeds the combined capacity of the conferences services; and
  - (b) That arrears of translation are in consequence accumulating [7];
- (3) (a) The question of machinery for regulating the frequency and meetingplace of <u>ad hoc</u> bodies and <u>ad hoc</u> conferences, with reference to paragraph 17(a), (b) and (c) of A/C.5/722;
  - (b) The question whether, in the absence of a specified base, Headquarters, New York, is to be deemed the base of an <u>ad hoc</u> body. The relation of paragraph 2(c) of the United Kingdom proposal (A/C.5/L.471) to this point would need to be considered;
- (4) Whether to recommend a policy and, if so, of what nature to regulate the holding of sessions away from headquarters upon invitation of Governments, with particular reference to the financing of the extra costs;

- (5) Whether, in the event that the broad outline of the present Geneva pattern is maintained,
  - (a) Only one functional commission of the Economic and Social Council in addition to the Narcotic Drugs Commission should meet at Geneva; and
  - (b) Any overlap should be authorized between the session of the International Law Commission and that of the Council;
- (6) Whether to exclude from the Sub-Committee's review certain categories of United Nations bodies, for example, Administrative Tribunal, United Nations Joint Staff Pension Board, Administrative Committee on Co-ordination, and Consultative Committee on Administrative Questions.
