Gentlemen,

We have the honour to send you herewith the original of a medical certificate with 6 copies, of the Director of the European Hospital in USUMBURA, stating that our brother COSTAS MAZIS having been attacked by a crisis of Epilepsie crease, on the way, he was treated by it. As it appears from the examination in the hospital, Epilepsie disease in our brother is the consequence of wounds on the head caused to him in 1944.

We very much regret that we some times trouble you by letters and memorandums, but unfortunately there is no other way for us than to take refuge to the Department for Non-Self-Governing Territories of the United Nations.

The sacrifice of Messrs. the Judgers in Usumbura, has already taken place. They have called two false-courts, without having called the witness of accusation, and thus the assassin escaped the punishment of gallows, and is circulating free, and whenever sees our brother on the street he spit to him crying SAL CREC.

The victim with his II wounds and the Epilepsie disease has lost every element of fortune owing to the attempt for assassination the expenses for cure, Medecins, Hospital, drugs etc. and therefore he cannot work, and is helped by passengers whenever attacked by the crisis of Epilepsie on the way.

The civilisation of a European state has been sacrified by bad and perjurer judgers and by the egoism of a State, trying to conceal injustice.

As we are going to the disaster, we have a single hope, that our matter be brought to your Department, and to a Commission in order to examinate our case at our charge, and the rendering of justice.
