Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments

Appointment of members of the Joint Inspection Unit

Note by the President of the General Assembly

1. As indicated in paragraph 6 of the note by the Secretary-General of 5 November 2018 ([A/73/479](#) and [A/73/479/Corr.1](#)), the General Assembly is required, during its current session, to appoint one member of the Joint Inspection Unit to fill the vacancy that will arise from the expiration on 31 December 2019 of the term of office of Keiko Kamioka.
2. In accordance with the procedures described in article 3, paragraph 1, of the statute of the Joint Inspection Unit and with General Assembly resolution [61/238](#), the President of the General Assembly, having held the necessary consultations, and on the basis of the candidate submitted by the Asia-Pacific States, requested Japan to propose a candidate (see annex I).
3. The candidate, in accordance with paragraph 7 of General Assembly resolution [59/267](#), should have experience in at least one of the following fields: oversight, audit, inspection, investigation, evaluation, finance, project evaluation, programme evaluation, human resources management, management, public administration, monitoring and/or programme performance, as well as knowledge of the United Nations system and its role in international relations.
4. The President of the General Assembly has held the consultations described in article 3, paragraph 2, of the statute of the Joint Inspection Unit, including consultations with the President of the Economic and Social Council and with the Secretary-General in his capacity as Chair of the United Nations System Chief Executives Board for Coordination. The replies received from the President of the Council and from the Secretary-General to the identical letters addressed to them on 20 November 2018 by the President of the Assembly are annexed to the present note (see annexes II and III).
5. Having completed the required consultations, the President of the General Assembly has the honour to submit to the Assembly the candidature of Ms. Kamioka for reappointment as a member of the Joint Inspection Unit for a five-year term beginning on 1 January 2020 and expiring on 31 December 2024.
