Dear Sir,

Humbly we the signatories submit our request of considering the decisions of the United Nations. You being the representatives of the said group we feel quite assured that you will not be deviated from the right path of truth by the Belgians.

The troubles that have made you come in the country were caused by the Belgians, consequently in your procedure should not be influenced by any exterior agency mainly the Belgian Govt.

May we put it before attention that in Uganda there is enormous group of Banyaruanda who urgently request the return of the Umwami J. Kigeri V UNO being the one who passed her judgement on Ruanda no longer being a Republic and therefore we hope of the quick return of Umwami on his throne. Again we urgently request of freeing those people imprisoned. Use your power which has been untrusted to you. Further more we are of the opinion of sending out the Belgian Govt., this will prevent what happened to Umwami Yuki V, Musinga, Patrick Lumumba and to Chombe in Katange; the death of Charles Mutara III should be investigated. That will mean salvation, peace, and freedom for Ruanda Urundi; otherwise it a chaos.
