LETTER DATED 6 APRIL 1993 FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE GOVERNING  
COUNCIL OF THE UNITED NATIONS COMPENSATION COMMISSION ADDRESSED  
TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of the Security Council, the following report on the ninth session of the Governing Council of the United Nations Compensation Commission, held from 29 March to 1 April 1993.

At its 33rd plenary meeting, held on 31 March 1993, the Governing Council appointed, upon nomination by the Secretary-General, Commissioners for the panels dealing with consolidated claims in categories A, B and C.

The Commissioners appointed are as follows:

Claims in category A (departure from Iraq or Kuwait):

Claims in category B (death or serious personal injury):

I enclose herewith document S/AC.26/1993/R.5, containing the text of the letter from the Executive Secretary transmitting the names of the candidates nominated by the Secretary-General for appointment as Commissioners, together with their curricula vitae.

At its 34th plenary meeting, held on 1 April 1993, the Governing Council, having been informed by a number of Governments of the difficulties they were encountering in submitting claims in categories A, B, C and D to the Commission within the time-limit (1 July 1993), authorized as an exception, and requested

the Executive Secretary to grant an extension to 1 October 1993 for the submission of claims in those categories, if such an extension was requested by 1 July 1993 by any Government or entity responsible for submitting claims on behalf of persons not in a position to have them submitted by a Government.

The Governing Council expressed concern at the fact that the Commission's work continued to be jeopardized by the lack of financial resources, even though an amount of \$21 million had been deposited in the Compensation Fund in December 1992, and requested the President to take the necessary steps, in consultation with the Executive Secretary, to ensure that the Commission would have the necessary financial support.

The Executive Secretary informed the Governing Council, inter alia, that the secretariat had so far received approximately 700,000 claims.

It was decided that the Governing Council's next session should be held from 26 to 30 July 1993.
