We had voted very ignorantly and and also under intimedations and we wish to put it clear before you that the vote should not be taken very seriously at all.

We are not ready for unification at all. We want you to understand that we are for the British Commonwealth of Nations.

We thought we were voting for cesation from Nigeria and remain by ourselves, we never knew we were voting for unification at all.

We will be very grateful if you will do all to prevent from it.
