At an Emergency Meeting of the K.N.D.P. held over the week-end at No. 15 Okesuna Village Road, Surulere, it was unanimously decided that the U.N.O. be communicated and urged to discountenance any representations made to it by the N.P.C. in respect of the Northern Cameroons.

The people of this area (Northern Cameroons) have a right to decide what is suitable for them and have glaringly made this manifest with the result of the recent plebiscite.

The N.P.C. should not be allowed to force themselves on the people of the Northern Cameroons through an appeal to the U.N.O.

That other political parties including representatives of both the Northern Cameroons and K.N.D.P. be given a hearing if the U.N.O. cannot alter its decision to hear the case of the N.P.C.

That we whole heartedly support the recommendation of the A.G. published in the Sunday Express of Sunday 29 November 1959.

That copies of this resolution be sent to the High Commissioner for the Cameroons; the Colonial Secretary, The Press and Radio.
