New international humanitarian order

The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolution 47/106 of 16 December 1992 and pertinent preceding resolutions $\underline{1}$ / relating to the promotion of a new international humanitarian order and of international cooperation in the humanitarian field,

<u>Taking note</u> of the report of the Secretary-General $\underline{2}$ / and the preceding reports $\underline{3}$ / containing the comments and views of Governments, specialized agencies and non-governmental organizations,

Noting that a number of Governments have not yet made their comments in the context of the above-mentioned resolutions,

- 1. <u>Expressing its appreciation</u> to the Secretary-General for his continuing support to the efforts to promote a new international humanitarian order;
- 2. <u>Urges</u> Governments as well as governmental and non-governmental organizations that have not yet done so to provide their comments and views to the Secretary-General regarding the promotion of the new international humanitarian order;
- 3. <u>Requests</u> Governments to make available to the Secretary-General, on a voluntary basis, information and expertise on humanitarian issues of special concern to them in order to identify opportunities for future action;
- 4. <u>Invites</u> the Independent Bureau for Humanitarian Issues to continue and further strengthen its activities in cooperation with the governmental and non-governmental bodies concerned;
- 5. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to remain in contact with Governments as well as non-governmental organizations and the Independent Bureau for Humanitarian Issues and to report on the progress made by them to the General Assembly at its fifty-first session;
- 6. <u>Decides</u> to review at its fifty-first session the question of a new international humanitarian order.
