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ITEM 8:* THE ENVIRONMENT FUND, OTHER FINANCIAL MATTERS AND ADMINISTRATION

MANAGEMENT OF TRUST FUNDS AND COUNTERPART CONTRIBUTIONS

Report of the Executive Director

Summary

The present report describes developments relating to the trust funds since the sixteenth session of the Governing Council, summarizing, in tabular form, the actions taken in response to the decisions of the Council at that session. Annexes I and II, provide, for each trust fund, the 1990-1991 biennium audited expenditures, the 1992-1993 biennium estimated expenditures, and the 1994-1995 projected expenditures. Due to its special characteristics, the Trust Fund for the Multilateral Fund under the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer is presented separately in both Annexes I and II. Chapter II and Annex III of the report deal briefly with counterpart contributions.

Suggested action by the Governing Council

The Governing Council may wish to:

- Take note of the report on the management of trust funds and counterpart contributions and of the developments relating to trust funds administered by the Executive Director, as described in the Annual Report for 1991;
- Express its appreciation to Governments, intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations and other institutions that have increased their support to UNEP by means of contributions to trust funds, specific counterpart contributions and contributions in kind;
- Note that all the trust funds established within the framework of the Environment Fund should be considered in accordance with Article V of the General Procedures Governing the Operations of the Fund of the United Nations Environment Programme;

- Note that the Executive Director will apply, *mutatis mutandis*, the financial policies and procedures of the Secretary-General which relate to trust funds;

- Note that the efforts aimed at reducing the number of trust funds did not meet with the approval of participating Governments;

- Note and approve the establishment of the following general trust funds by the Executive Director, under the General Procedures Governing the Operations of the Fund of the United Nations Environment Programme, since the sixteenth session of the Governing Council:

(a) *Trust Fund for the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal*, expiry date 31 December 1994; and

(b) *Trust Fund to Assist Developing Countries and Other Countries in Need of Technical Assistance in the Implementation of the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal*, expiry date 31 December 1994.

- Note and approve the establishment of the following technical cooperation trust funds by the Executive Director, under the General Procedures Governing the Operations of the Fund of the United Nations Environment Programme, since the sixteenth session of the Governing Council:

(a) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for UNEP's Implementation of the Activities Funded by the Interim Multilateral Fund Established under the Montreal Protocol*, expiry date 31 December 1993; and

(b) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for the Establishment of the International Environmental Technology Centre in Japan*, expiry date 31 December 1993.

- Note and approve the establishment, on a contingency basis, of the *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for the Provision of Junior Professional Officers (financed by the Government of Belgium)*, by the Executive Director, under the General Procedures Governing the Operations of the Fund of the United Nations Environment Programme;

- Note and approve the following changes in the names of some general and technical cooperation trust funds:

(a) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for UNEP's Implementation of the Multilateral Fund Activities*: formerly the *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for UNEP's Implementation of the Activities Funded by the Interim Multilateral Fund Established under the Montreal Protocol*;

(b) *Trust Fund for the Multilateral Fund under the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer*: formerly the *Trust Fund for the Interim Multilateral Fund under the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer*; and

(c) *Trust Fund for the Financing of the New International Environment Prize*: formerly the *Trust Fund for the Sasakawa Environment Prize*.

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- Note and approve the extension of the following general trust funds by the Executive Director:

(a) *Regional Trust Fund for the Implementation of the Action Plan for the Caribbean Environment Programme*, to be extended through 31 December 1995;

(b) *Trust Fund for the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES)*, to be extended through 31 December 1998;

(c) *Trust Fund for the Multilateral Fund under the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer*, to have an open expiry date; and

(d) *Trust Fund for the Convention on Conservation of Migratory Species of Wild animals (CMS)*, to be extended through 31 December 1994.

- Note and approve the extension of the following technical cooperation trust funds by the Executive Director:

(a) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund to Provide Consultancies to Developing Countries (financed by the Government of Finland)*, to be extended through 31 December 1994;

(b) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund to Support the Clearing-house Mechanism with Consultancies on Strategies for Dealing with Serious Environment Problems (financed by the Government of Norway)*, to be extended through 31 December 1993;

(c) *Technical Assistance Trust Fund for the Integrated Pilot Project on Environmental Management and Protection of Andean Ecosystems (financed by the Government of Germany)*, to be extended through 31 December 1993;

(d) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for Financing of Professional Officers (financed by the Government of the Republic of Korea)* to be extended through 31 December 1993; and

(e) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund to Assist Developing Countries to Take Action for the Protection of the Ozone Layer under the Vienna Convention and Montreal Protocol (financed by the Government of Finland)*, to be extended through 31 December 1993.

- Approve the extension of the following general trust funds by the Executive Director, subject to UNEP's receiving requests to do so from the relevant Governments of the region or Contracting Parties:

(a) *Regional Seas Trust Fund for the Eastern African Region*, to be extended through 31 December 1995;

(b) *Regional Trust Fund for the Implementation of the Action Plan for the Protection and Development of the Marine Environment and Coastal Areas of East Asian Seas*, to be extended through 31 December 1995;

(c) *Trust Fund for the Environmental Training Network in Latin America and the Caribbean*, to be extended through 31 December 1995;

(d) *Regional Trust Fund for Protection and Development of the Marine Environment and Coastal Areas of Bahrain, Iran, Iraq, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates*, to be extended through 31 December 1995;

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(e) *Trust Fund for Protection of the Mediterranean Sea Against Pollution*, to be extended through 31 December 1995; and

(f) *Trust Fund for the Protection and Development of the Marine Environment and Coastal Areas of the West and Central African Region* to be extended through 31 December 1995.

- Approve the extension of the following technical cooperation trust funds by the Executive Director, subject to the conclusion of agreements on the required extensions:

(a) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for Control of Environmental Health Hazards and Promotion of Chemical Safety* (financed by the Government of Germany), to be extended through 31 December 1993;

(b) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for Activities in Developing Countries on Environmental Awareness and Machinery* (financed by the Government of Germany), to be extended through 31 December 1994;

(c) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for Establishment of a Global Resource Information Database (GRID) Centre in Arendal* (financed by the Government of Norway), to be extended in line with the date to be agreed;

(d) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for UNEP's Implementation of the Activities Funded by the Global Environment Facility*, to be extended through 31 December 1995;

(e) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund to Provide Experts to UNEP/GRID* (financed by the Government of Denmark), to be extended in line with the date to be agreed;

(f) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for UNEP's Implementation of the Multilateral Fund Activities*, to have an open expiry date;

(g) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund to Assist the Implementation of the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer in Developing Countries* (financed by the Government of Sweden), to be extended through 31 December 1995;

(h) *INFOTERRA Technical Cooperation Trust Fund* (financed by the Government of the United States), to be extended through 31 December 1995;

(i) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund to Develop and Coordinate the Implementation of the Plan for the Survey, Assessment and Dealing with the Consequences of Environmental Damage Caused by Conflict between Kuwait and Iraq*, to be extended through 31 December 1993;

(j) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund to Promote Technical Cooperation and Assistance in Industrial, Environmental and Raw Material Management* (financed by the Government of Sweden), to be extended through 31 December 1995; and

(k) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund to Assist Developing Countries to Take Action for the Protection of the Ozone Layer under the Vienna Convention and Montreal Protocol* (financed by the Government of Finland), to be extended through 31 December 1993.

- Note and approve the closure of the following general and technical cooperation trust funds and special account by the Executive Director:

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(a) *Special Account to Finance the Implementation of the Plan of Action to Combat Desertification;*

(b) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for Provision of a Forestry Officer (financed by the Government of the United States);*

(c) *The United Nations Trust Fund for the Environment Stamp Conservation Fund;*

(d) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund to Provide Experts to the UNEP Ozone Layer Secretariat (financed by the Government of the United States; and*

(e) *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund to Provide Experts to UNEP to Assist in the Development and Implementation of Policy Response Options Related to Climate Change (financed by the Government of the Netherlands).*

- *Note and approve UNEP's acceptance of a \$137,209 counterpart contribution, from Dentsu Incorporated, towards the Earth Day ceremony in 1992.*

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I. MANAGEMENT OF TRUST FUNDS

1. In the United Nations, trust funds are divided into two broad categories: *technical cooperation trust funds*; and *general trust funds*. The technical cooperation trust fund category includes all trust funds which provide assistance to developing countries for economic and social development. The general trust fund category includes all trust funds established to support activities other than those covered by the technical cooperation category.
2. Although the trust funds managed by UNEP fall into one or other of two broad categories described above, they can be further subdivided into the following three groups. In the first group are the trust funds that were established to finance activities relating to regional seas programmes, international conventions and protocols. Second, there are the trust funds that provide assistance to developing countries in the implementation of their programmes. In the third group are trust funds established to administer personnel provided by Governments to the UNEP secretariat.
3. While trust fund resources complement the resources available in the Environment Fund, they cannot in any way replace the funds programmed for use by that Fund. Trust funds are earmarked for Parties to Conventions, action plans established under Conventions or for Governments for specific activities.
4. In 1989, a full description of all the trust funds in existence was presented to the Governing Council in the *1989 Annual Report of the Executive Director*. The *1990 and 1991 Annual Reports of the Executive Director*, respectively, contain only descriptions of the trust funds established since 1989. The present report complements those latter by describing in full only those trust funds established after the sixteenth session of the Governing Council.
5. During 1991, the Office of Programme Planning, Budget and Finance of the United Nations Secretariat reviewed the authority of the Secretary-General and of the Executive Director of UNEP with regard to the establishment of trust funds, the Financial Regulations and Rules under which they operate and the associated financial policies. As a result of that review, the Executive Director was advised by the United Nations Controller that all UNEP trust funds should be considered as falling under Article V of the General Procedures Governing the Operations of the Fund of the United Nations Environment Programme. In spite of this, the financial policies of the Secretary-General which relate to trust funds should not cease to be applied to UNEP trust funds. This means that the Executive Director has the authority, subject to the approval of the Governing Council, to establish not only technical cooperation trust funds, for which the Secretary-General had already granted authority, but also new general trust funds.
6. Accordingly, the Governing Council is requested to note that all the trust funds hitherto established by the Secretary-General should be considered as trust funds within the framework of the Environment Fund, as provided for in Article V of the General Procedures of the Environment Fund.
7. The Governing Council is also requested to note that the establishment and extension of the duration of all trust funds is now a decision to be made by the Executive Director with the approval of the Governing Council. In making any such decisions, she will apply, *mutatis mutandis*, the financial policies of the Secretary-General which relate to trust funds.

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8. General trust funds are established to support activities other than those which can be classified as exclusively technical cooperation. General trust funds may be used, for example, to enhance the work programme of one or more of the organizational units of the UNEP secretariat. General trust funds may be continuous or long-term, with annual programming of their resources; they may be created for specific purposes or for a shorter term. The general trust funds administered by UNEP range from those established to finance activities relating to the Regional Seas Programme, through to those that relate to Conventions concerning migratory species and the governance of trade in endangered species. Annex I to the present report provides brief details of the current status of each of the general trust funds administered by UNEP, as well as suggested action by the Council in connection with each one. Since the sixteenth session of the Governing Council, two new general trust funds have been established, their purposes are described in paragraphs 28 and 30, respectively. Annex I provides brief details of the current status of each of the technical cooperation trust funds administered by UNEP, and the Council is requested to note and approve the Executive Director's actions. Annex II summarizes the financial status for the current, preceding and next biennia.

9. Technical cooperation trust funds provide assistance to developing countries for economic and social development. Such assistance usually takes the form of provision of experts and associate experts, the financing of individual or group training, such as regional or interregional seminars, workshops and study tours; and the provision of project equipment. Since the sixteenth session of the Governing Council, one new technical cooperation trust fund has been established and its purpose is described in paragraph 21.

10. Under the technical cooperation trust funds comes the administration of funds provided by Governments to finance Professional Officers to work at various levels in UNEP. There are currently nine Junior Professional Officer technical cooperation trust funds and six Professional Officer technical cooperation trust funds.

11. In its decision 16/46, paragraph 14, the Governing Council requested the Executive Director to produce options for reducing the number of trust funds administered by UNEP. As a first step, UNEP suggested to the Committee of Permanent Representatives at its thirty-fourth meeting that it consider the pros and cons of merging the 15 trust funds involving staff. These trust funds include those established bilaterally between individual donor Governments and UNEP in order to provide experts at both Senior and Junior Professional levels. At the same meeting, it was agreed that the secretariat would send letters to all Governments currently contributing to such schemes, seeking their consent to merge these trust funds. In those discussions it was also agreed that if these trust funds could not be merged, there was little possibility of combining others. Each of the eleven Governments for whom UNEP operates a Junior or Senior Professional Officers trust fund were canvassed on the proposal to combine all the Professional Officers trust funds into a single trust fund. Of the eleven Governments approached, only five responded, and of these only one agreed unequivocally to the terms and conditions under which the general Professional Officers trust fund would operate. Three of the five respondents said that they could not agree to the proposed merger conditions and one asked for more time to consider the implications of such a move.

12. The Governing Council is requested to note that the proposal aimed at reducing the number of Professional Officers trust funds by merger is unlikely to be accepted by the majority of participating Governments.

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13. Negotiations are under way with the Government of Belgium concerning the establishment of a technical cooperation trust fund for the provision of Junior Professional Officers. It is likely that this trust fund will be established in 1993, and that it will not have a fixed expiry date. The Governing Council is requested to note and approve the establishment of this trust fund on a contingency basis, subject to the conclusion of a formal agreement.

14. The following paragraphs contain brief descriptions of the general and technical cooperation trust funds established since the sixteenth session of the Governing Council as well as any major developments in trust funds established prior to that session.

15. The Amendment to the Montreal Protocol adopted by the Second Meeting of the Parties in London, entered into force on 10 August 1992. In addition, the Fourth Meeting of the Parties to the Montreal Protocol, in decision IV/18, I, decided to make the Multilateral Fund operative from 1 January 1993. Thus, as of 1 January 1993 the Trust Fund for the Interim Multilateral Fund under the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer effectively became the *"Trust Fund for the Multilateral Fund under the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer"*. The terms of reference for the Multilateral Fund are essentially those of the Interim Multilateral Fund, except that the expiry date is no longer fixed.

16. The Governing Council is requested to note and approve the establishment of the general trust fund entitled *Trust Fund for the Multilateral Fund under the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer*. All the assets and liabilities of the Interim Fund have been transferred to the new fund with effect from 1 January 1993.

17. In response to the request by the First Meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal, held in Piriapolis, (Uruguay) in December 1992, the Executive Director established the *"Trust Fund for the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal"*. This trust fund was initially established for a period of two years, beginning 1 January 1993 and ending 31 December 1994; it will meet the costs of the Basel Convention Secretariat and the Convention's programme activities.

18. The Governing Council is requested to note and approve the establishment of the general trust fund named *Trust Fund for the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal*.

19. In response to a further request by the First Meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal, the Executive Director also established the *"Trust Fund to Assist Developing Countries and Other Countries in Need of Technical Assistance in the Implementation of the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal"*. This trust fund was initially established for the period of two years, beginning 1 January 1993 and ending 31 December 1994; it will be used for the provision of technical assistance to developing countries and other countries in implementing the Basel Convention and controlling transboundary movements of hazardous wastes and their disposal.

20. The Governing Council is requested to note and approve the establishment of the general trust fund entitled *Trust Fund to Assist Developing Countries and Other Countries in Need of Technical Assistance in the Implementation of the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal*.

21. In its decision 16/34, the Governing Council called upon the Executive Director, *inter alia*, to work out the pertinent details and then establish an International Environmental Technology Centre. The International Environmental Technology Centre is dedicated to the transfer of environmentally sound technologies to developing countries and countries with economies in transition by providing training and consulting services, carrying out research, and accumulating and disseminating related information with a special focus on the environmentally sustainable management of big cities and freshwater lake/reservoir basins. Following the initial offer by the Government of Japan, the Executive Director established a *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for the Establishment of the International Environmental Technology Centre in Japan*. This trust fund will manage the establishment of the centre, as well as its subsequent activities; it has an initial timespan from 10 December 1992 to 31 December 1993. It is likely that an extension through 1995 will be required.

22. The Governing Council is requested to note and approve the establishment of the *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for the Establishment of the International Environmental Technology Centre in Japan*.

23. The Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for the Control of Environmental Health Hazards and Promotion of Chemical Safety (financed by the Government of Germany) was scheduled for closure in 1991. However, the remaining balances were later used to fund a workshop in 1992 and this made it necessary for the Executive Director to extend the trust fund through 31 December 1993.

24. The Governing Council is requested to note and approve the extension of the trust fund on a contingency basis, subject to the agreement of the Government of Germany.

25. In 1991 the Executive Director established the Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for UNEP's Implementation of the Activities Funded by the Interim Multilateral Fund Established under the Montreal Protocol. This was done after the negotiation and conclusion of an agreement between UNEP as an implementing agency and the Executive Committee of the Fund. In the light of the establishment of the full fund, the Executive Director will accordingly rename the trust fund. The new name will be *Technical Cooperation Trust Fund for UNEP's Implementation of the Multilateral Fund Activities*. The expiry date will not be fixed.

26. The Governing Council is requested to note and approve the establishment of this trust fund and the subsequent change of name and expiry date.

27. Action to reflect the new title of the trust fund which administers the Sasakawa International Environment Prize was taken during 1992. The Trust Fund for the Sasakawa Environment Prize becomes the *Trust Fund for Financing the New International Environment Prize*. The Governing Council is requested to note this change of the trust fund's name.

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II. COUNTERPART CONTRIBUTIONS

28. Counterpart contributions are received and managed under rule 204.1 of the Financial Rules of the Fund of the United Nations Environment Programme. They may be made in cash or kind for specific services and facilities as described in individual project documents.

29. Counterpart contributions are not subject to the same conditions as trust funds and they are given by donors for specific activities, such as those contained in a project document. Contributions for the 1990-1991 biennium amounted to \$11,932,039; while \$9,004,704 is estimated for 1992.

30. In 1992, counterpart contributions were made in the following amounts in both convertible and non-convertible currencies by the following bodies: Governments \$7,616,244;; regional organizations \$368,517;; United Nations organizations \$497,970;; non-governmental organizations \$211,052;; educational institutions \$2,381 and private entities: \$308,540. Annex III to the present report presents details.

31. Funds received as counterpart contributions during 1992 were used for various purposes such as: to support the travel of participants from developing countries to meetings related to the adoption of protocols and conventions, as in the case of the Basel Convention or the Convention on Biological Diversity; to cover the attendance of participants at workshops and seminars (as is the case in almost all projects); to fund the production of a specific output or event such as the preparation of a methodology to undertake national greenhouse gases abatement costing studies or the organization of the Earth Day Ceremony. Counterpart contributions were also provided to assist with the running of a particular unit, such as the Industry and Environment Programme Activity Centre or the Mediterranean Coordinating Unit by covering operational costs such as salaries of local staff and communications.

32. While it is encouraging to see the volume of counterpart contributions growing at a steady rate, there is a danger that Governments are diverting resources away from the Environment Fund towards projects or activities more in line with particular Government's interests. This growth may be at the expense of the growth of the Environment Fund.

33. In accordance with UNEP's Financial Rules, the Governing Council is requested to note and approve acceptance by UNEP of a \$137,209 counterpart contribution, from Dentsu Incorporated, towards the Earth Day Ceremony in 1992.
