Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Cuba, Egypt, Indonesia, Malaysia, Malta, Senegal, Tunisia and United Arab Emirates: revised draft resolution

The General Assembly,

<u>Having considered</u> the report of the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People, $\underline{1}/$

<u>Taking note</u>, in particular, of the information contained in paragraphs 70 to 83 of that report,

Recalling its resolution 48/158 C of 20 December 1993,

<u>Convinced</u> that the world-wide dissemination of accurate and comprehensive information and the role of non-governmental organizations and institutions remain of vital importance in heightening awareness of and support for the inalienable rights of the Palestinian people,

<u>Aware</u> of the Declaration of Principles on Interim Self-Government Arrangements signed by the Government of the State of Israel and the Palestine Liberation Organization on 13 September 1993 in Washington, D.C., $\underline{2}$ / and of the subsequent implementation agreements, including the Agreement on the Gaza

Strip and the Jericho Area, signed on 4 May 1994 at Cairo, $\underline{3}$ / and their positive implications,

1. <u>Notes with appreciation</u> the action taken by the Department of Public Information of the Secretariat in compliance with General Assembly resolution 48/158 C;

2. <u>Considers</u> that the special information programme on the question of Palestine of the Department of Public Information helps to raise the awareness of the international community on the question and the situation in the Middle East in general, including the achievements of the peace process, and should continue to contribute effectively to an atmosphere conducive to dialogue and supportive of the peace process;

3. <u>Requests</u> the Department, in full cooperation and coordination with the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People, to continue, with the necessary flexibility as may be required by developments affecting the question of Palestine, its special information programme on the question of Palestine for the biennium 1994-1995, with particular emphasis on public opinion in Europe and North America, and, in particular:

(<u>a</u>) To disseminate information on all the activities of the United Nations system relating to the question of Palestine, including reports of the work carried out by the relevant United Nations organizations;

 (\underline{b}) To continue to issue and update publications on the various aspects of the question of Palestine in all fields, including materials concerning the recent developments in that regard and, in particular, the achievements of the peace process;

 (\underline{c}) To expand its audiovisual material on the question of Palestine, including the production of such material;

 (\underline{d}) To organize and promote fact-finding news missions and for journalists to the area, including the occupied territories;

 (\underline{e}) To organize international, regional and national encounters for journalists;

 (\underline{f}) To provide, in cooperation with specialized agencies of the United Nations system, particularly the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, assistance to the Palestinian people in the field of media development.
