LETTER DATED 13 JANUARY 1995 FROM THE CHARGE D'AFFAIRES A.I.
OF THE PERMANENT MISSION OF KUWAIT TO THE UNITED NATIONS
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

On instructions from my Government, I have the honour to transmit to you herewith a complete list of the military equipment belonging to the Kuwaiti Ministry of Defence that is still in the possession of Iraq.

In this connection, we should like to state as follows:

- 1. The list is not new and simply supplements lists previously submitted to the United Nations.
- 2. The list includes military equipment that was used by Iraqi forces in their deployment on Kuwait's northern borders in October 1994.
- 3. Kuwait does not accept the compensation mechanism as an alternative to the immediate return of the military equipment in question. As has once again been demonstrated, it is in the possession of Iraq's forces and Iraq is continuing to postpone its return.
- 4. The fact that Kuwait is demanding this military property at the present time does not diminish the importance or seriousness of its claims for all of the property seized by Iraqi forces during their occupation of the State of Kuwait.
- 5. Kuwait affirms its right to compensation for all military equipment that is determined on its return to be unserviceable.

Furthermore, Kuwait once more affirms that Iraq has continued to dissimulate and procrastinate with regard to meeting its obligations to the Security Council and has thus lost all credibility and forfeited all trust. This further demonstrates that peaceful intentions are lacking in Iraqi policy towards Kuwait and neighbouring countries.

I should be grateful if you would transmit a copy of the list to Iraq with a view to facilitating the return of all the items entered in it.

I should also be grateful if you would have this letter and its annex circulated as a document of the Security Council.
