Corrigendum

Section I, second subparagraph, dealing with the Functions of a High Commissioner for Human Rights, <u>should read</u> as follows:

The High Commissioner should:

be champion and spokesperson for the promotion and protection of human rights around the world;

oversee the implementation of decisions of all United Nations human rights bodies;

assume responsibility for human rights issues in the areas of peace-keeping, peacemaking, and humanitarian assistance;

coordinate all United Nations human rights programmes, and encourage and facilitate coordination, cooperation and information sharing among all United Nations system and humanitarian organizations including UNDP, UNICEF, WHO, ILO and others;

request the Secretary-General to bring to the attention of the Security Council serious violations of human rights which he believes may threaten international peace and security; and

have independent authority to dispatch special envoys on fact-finding missions and to undertake other initiatives to promote human rights.
