ELECTIONS

Election of one member of the International Narcotics Control Board under the provisions of article 10, paragraph 5, of the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs, 1961, as amended by the 1972 Protocol

Note by the Secretary-General

Election of one member from among the candidates nominated by Governments to fill the vacancy arising from the death of Raouf Ali Khan (Pakistan), for a term ending on 1 March 1997

1. On 8 August 1994, the Secretary-General was informed of the death of Raouf Ali Khan (Pakistan), a member of the International Narcotics Control Board (INCB), whose term was to expire on 1 March 1997.

2. Article 10, paragraph 5, of the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs, 1961, as amended by the 1972 Protocol, reads as follows:

"Where a vacancy occurs on the Board during the term of office of a member, the Council shall fill such vacancy as soon as possible and in accordance with the applicable provisions of article 9, by electing another member for the remainder of the term."

3. Since Raouf Ali Khan was elected by the Economic and Social Council in 1991 from among the candidates nominated by Governments, the member to be elected to fill the remainder of his term should be elected from a list of candidates nominated by Governments.

4. In accordance with established procedure, the Secretary-General, in a note dated 2 September 1994, invited States Members of the United Nations and Parties to the Single Convention that are not Members of the United Nations to nominate up to two candidates, with a view to filling the post for the remainder of the term, which would have expired on 1 March 1997.

5. As at 15 December 1994, 24 candidates had been proposed by Governments. Their names are given below, in alphabetical order.

Annex II

NUMBER, DURATION AND PLACE OF MEETINGS, PAYMENTS AND PRESENT
MEMBERSHIP OF THE INTERNATIONAL NARCOTICS CONTROL BOARD

1. The Board shall meet as often as, in its opinion, may be necessary for the proper discharge of its functions, but shall hold at least two sessions in each calendar year (Single Convention, art. 11, para. 2).

2. The duration of each session varies from one to three weeks. In 1994, the following sessions were held:

Fifty-sixth session, 9-19 May

Fifty-seventh session, 31 October-17 November

3. The sessions are normally held in the headquarters of the Board's secretariat in Vienna (Vienna International Centre).

4. In accordance with General Assembly resolution 2491 (XXIII) of 21 December 1968, the members of the Board receive a per diem allowance while participating in Board sessions or in official missions. As of August 1994, this allowance in Vienna is US\$ 277 per day. Members' travelling expenses are defrayed by the United Nations according to current administrative practice.

5. In accordance with General Assembly resolution 35/218 of 17 December 1980, members of the Board receive honoraria on the following annual basis:
