LETTER DATED 12 JULY 1993 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE  
OF BELGIUM TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE  
SECRETARY-GENERAL

Pursuant to paragraph 13 of Security Council resolution 841 (1993) on the situation in Haiti, I have the honour to transmit herewith a summary of the measures taken by Belgium to discharge its obligations under paragraphs 5 to 9 of that resolution:

1. The embargo on Haiti became part of the Belgian internal legal system through the adoption of EEC regulation No. 1608/93 of the Council of the European Communities on 24 June 1993. This regulation instituted an embargo on some of the trade between the European Economic Community and Haiti. It is of direct application and covers all the trade referred to in resolution 841 (1993).
2. As regards weapons, ammunition and related matériel, which in any event are still under licence, the provisions of resolution 841 (1993) have been notified to the administrations concerned.
3. The financial embargo measures decided on by the Security Council in resolution 841 (1993) are organized on the basis of article 1, paragraph 1, of the decree-law of 6 October 1944 concerning exchange control.

All the administrations concerned have been given the necessary information and have received the list of bodies and individuals whose assets are to be frozen.

In my capacity as representative of the President of the Council of the European Community, I am including the full text, in English and French, of the above-mentioned EEC regulation No. 1608/93 of the Council of European Communities of 24 June 1993,\* adopted pursuant to Security Council resolution

841 (1993). This regulation, which is applicable in the twelve States members of the European Community, entered into force on 26 June 1993, the date of its publication in the Official Gazette of the European Communities.
