WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION

1. The World Health Organization (WHO) has in 1992 and 1993 provided assistance to a number of Non-Self-Governing Territories in support of health development. During the period from November 1992 to May 1993, the following financial obligations were incurred for such purposes: for New Caledonia a total of US\$ 84,250, of which US\$ 57,500 is for acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) control purposes; for Palau, a total of US\$ 63,100 for human resource development, AIDS control and other purposes; and totals of US\$ 27,000 for American Samoa, US\$ 16,000 for Tokelau and US\$ 6,300 for Guam for various health purposes. Tokelau was admitted as an associate member of WHO in May 1991 (World Health Assembly resolution 44.3).
2. Technical cooperation for Anguilla, the British Virgin Islands and Montserrat is coordinated by the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO)/WHO through the Caribbean Programme Coordination Office in 1993 with emphasis on community water supply and sanitation, health services development, maternal and child health, and AIDS control. A total of US\$ 113,700 was approved for 1992 in support of projects in the Eastern Caribbean countries.
3. Technical cooperation for Bermuda and the Cayman Islands is coordinated through the Jamaica representation of PAHO/WHO, on a total 1993 budget of US\$ 54,400 for health services development and AIDS control. Additional sources of assistance include the PAHO/WHO country representation and subregional and regional programmes and initiatives.
4. Technical cooperation for the Turks and Caicos Islands is coordinated through the Bahamas country office of PAHO/WHO, with emphasis on community water supply and sanitation, health services development and AIDS control on a total budget of US\$ 26,200 for 1993.
