I. INTRODUCTION

1. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 23 September 1994, the General Assembly decided to include in the agenda of its forty-ninth session the item entitled "Programme budget for the biennium 1994-1995" and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.

2. The Fifth Committee considered the item at its 20th, 21st, 32nd, 34th to 37th meetings, on 17 and 21 November and 14 and 19 to 22 December 1994.

3. The comments and observations made in the course of the discussion of the item are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/49/SR.20, 21, 32, 34-37).

4. In accordance with the guidelines for the contingency fund, annexed to General Assembly resolution 42/211 of 21 December 1987, the Fifth Committee, at its 37th meeting, on 22 December 1994, considered a consolidated statement of all programme budget implications and revised estimates that were subject to the criteria for the use of the contingency fund and the corresponding report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, which was presented orally (see A/C.5/49/SR.37). The consolidated amount fell within the available balance of the contingency fund. The Committee, therefore, proceeded to approve the required amounts under the relevant sections of the programme budget.

5. Section II of the present report contains a summary of the recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the forty-ninth session of the General Assembly on the revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General and on the programme budget implications of resolutions adopted by the Assembly, either on the recommendation of its Main Committees or in respect of items dealt with in plenary meetings.

6. Section III of the report provides a summary of the special subjects considered by the Fifth Committee, other than the programme budget implications of draft resolutions and revised estimates, which led to the adoption of specific decisions to be recommended to the General Assembly.

7. The recommendations of the Fifth Committee are contained in section IV of the present report.

II. PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1994-1995

8. In its resolutions 48/231 A and B of 23 December 1993, the General Assembly approved appropriations for the biennium 1994-1995 in the amount of \$2,580,200,200 and estimates of income in the amount of \$447,401,700.

9. Recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the current session of the General Assembly on revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General, as well as on the programme budget implications of resolutions adopted by the Assembly under items considered by other Main Committees or in respect of items

dealt with in plenary meetings, have resulted in net increases in the approved level of appropriations in the amount of \$28,074,200 and net reduction in the approved estimates of income in the amount of \$45,321,200.

10. The revised estimates of expenditure and income approved by the Fifth Committee and the financial implications of resolutions recommended by other Main Committees and subsequently by the General Assembly are indicated, by expenditure and income section, below:

11. At its 37th meeting, on 22 December 1994, the Fifth Committee considered the revised estimates of expenditure and income to be recommended for approval by the General Assembly for the biennium 1994-1995, as well as the financing of the appropriations for the year 1995. The Committee took the following action:

(a) The Committee approved the revised budget appropriations for the biennium 1994-1995 (see para. 27, draft resolution II A);

(b) The Committee approved the revised income estimates for the biennium 1994-1995 (see para. 27, draft resolution II B);

(c) The Committee approved the draft resolution on the financing of the appropriations for the year 1995 (see para. 27, draft resolution II C).

III. CONSIDERATION OF SPECIAL SUBJECTS

1. Financing for the expansion of the United Nations Observer Mission in South Africa

12. The Committee considered this question at its 33rd meeting, on 16 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/49/38). The report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions was presented orally by the Chairman.

13. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend that the General Assembly approve an additional appropriation of \$19,266,000 under section 4, Peace-keeping operations and special missions, of the programme budget for 1994-1995 and an appropriation of \$1,464,200 under section 28, Staff assessment, to be offset by income in the same amount under income section 1, Income from staff assessment (see para. 27, draft resolution I, sect. I).

2. Agreement relating to the implementation of part XI of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982

14. The Committee considered this question at its 34th and 35th meetings, on 19 and 20 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/49/25) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/49/7/Add.3).

15. At the 35th meeting, on 20 December, the Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend that the General Assembly approve an additional appropriation of \$776,000 under section 32, International Seabed Authority, of the programme budget for 1994-1995, offset by a reduction of the same amount under section 7, Legal activities (see para. 27, draft resolution I, sect. II).

3. Human rights

16. The Committee considered this question at its 35th and 36th meetings, on 20 and 21 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/49/53) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/49/7/Add.6).

17. At the 36th meeting, on 21 December, the Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend that the General Assembly approve an appropriation of \$4,473,000 under section 21, Human rights, of the programme budget for 1994-1995, on the understanding that the posts requested by the Secretary-General in his report (A/C.5/49/53) for the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights, the Centre for Human Rights and the United Nations human rights presence in Cambodia are approved on a temporary basis, and an appropriation of \$1,022,900 under section 28, Staff assessment, to be offset by an increase in the same amount under income section 1, Income from staff assessment, subject to a detailed review by the Advisory Committee and the General Assembly (see para. 27, draft resolution I, sect. III).

4. Revised estimates under sections 3A, 3B, 3C, 4, 8, 15, 24 and 28 and income section 1

18. The Committee considered this question at its 35th and 36th meetings, on 20 and 21 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/49/44) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/49/7/Add.4).

19. At the 36th meeting, on 21 December, the Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend that the General Assembly approve the continuation of six temporary posts for the servicing of the Security Council Sanctions Committee with the related costs to be met from resources currently appropriated under section 3 (Political affairs) of the programme budget for the biennium 1994-1995 and accept the redeployment of \$576,600 from section 3, Political affairs, to section 8, Department for Policy Coordination and Sustainable Development, of the programme budget for the biennium 1994-1995 for activities related to the international convention to combat desertification subject to review and adjustment by the Advisory Committee and the General Assembly (see para. 27, draft resolution I, sect. IV).

5. Africa: critical economic situation, recovery and development

20. The Committee considered this question at its 20th, 35th and 36th meetings, on 17 November and 20 and 21 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/48/74 and Add.1) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/49/7/Add.8).

21. At the 36th meeting, the Chairman of the Committee, following informal consultations, introduced a draft resolution entitled "Africa: critical economic situation, recovery and development" (A/C.5/49/L.23).

22. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.5/49/L.23 without a vote (see para. 27, draft resolution I, sect. V).

/...

6. First performance report

23. The Committee considered this question at its 36th meeting, on 21 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/49/43) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/49/7/Add.8).

24. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend to the General Assembly that it take note of the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/49/43) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/49/7/Add.8) and approve a net decrease of \$21,036,900 in the appropriations approved for the biennium 1994-1995 and a net decrease of \$49,085,100 in the estimates of income for the biennium 1994-1995, to be apportioned among expenditure and income sections as indicated in the report of the Secretary-General (see para. 27, draft resolution I, sect. VI).

7. Contingency fund

25. The Committee considered this question at its 37th meeting, on 22 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/49/55). The report of the Advisory Committee was presented orally by its Chairman.

26. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend that the General Assembly appropriate the required amounts, as contained in the report of the Secretary-General, as orally revised. The Committee also decided to recommend to the General Assembly that it note that a balance of \$1,362,800 would remain in the contingency fund (see para. 27, draft resolution I, sect. VII).

Budget appropriations in a total amount of 1,335,407,400 United States dollars, consisting of 1,290,100,100 dollars, being half of the appropriations initially approved for the biennium 1994-1995 by the General Assembly in its resolution 48/231 A of 23 December 1993, plus 28,074,200 dollars, being the increase in the appropriations approved during the forty-ninth session by resolution A above, plus 17,233,100 dollars, being the increase in the appropriation for the biennium 1990-1991 approved by the Assembly in its resolution _____, shall be financed in accordance with regulations 5.1 and 5.2 of the Financial Regulations of the United Nations as follows:

(a) 75,295,460 dollars, consisting of:

- (i) An amount of 33,018,750 dollars, being the net half of the estimated income, other than staff assessment, approved for the biennium 1994-1995 by the General Assembly in its resolution 48/231 B of 23 December 1993;
- (ii) 2,826,300 dollars, being the increase in estimated income other than staff assessment income approved in resolution B above;
- (iii) 37,468,110 dollars, being the balance of the surplus account as at 31 December 1993;
- (iv) 1,982,300 dollars, being the increase in income other than staff assessment income for the biennium 1990-1991 approved by the Assembly in its resolution _____;

(b) 1,260,111,940 dollars, being the assessment on Member States in accordance with resolution 48/223 of 23 December 1993 on the scale of assessments for the years 1994 and 1995;

2. There shall be set off against the assessment on Member States, in accordance with the provisions of General Assembly resolution 973 (X) of 15 December 1955, their respective share in the Tax Equalization Fund in the total amount of 167,334,119 dollars, consisting of:

(a) 205,682,100 dollars, being half of the estimated staff assessment income approved by the Assembly in its resolution 48/231 B;

(b) Less 48,147,500 dollars, being the estimated decrease in income from staff assessment approved by the Assembly in resolution B above;

(c) Plus 2,501,819 dollars, being the increase in income from staff assessment compared to the revised estimates for the biennium 1992-1993 approved by the Assembly in its resolution 48/219 of 23 December 1993;
