LETTER DATED 1 SEPTEMBER 1993 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to refer to Security Council resolution 858 (1993) adopted on 24 August 1993, by which the Council decided to establish a United Nations Observer Mission in Georgia (UNOMIG).

Having completed the necessary consultations, I propose that the military observers of UNOMIG be from the following States, all of which have expressed their readiness in principle to make the necessary personnel available: Austria, Bangladesh, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Germany, Greece, Poland, Sierra Leone, Sweden and Switzerland.

I am awaiting a reply from certain other States which have been informally approached and will revert to the Security Council when I have an indication of whether they are also ready in principle to contribute military personnel to this mission.
